Be aware of trip hazards and overgrown gorse...please look carefully

We shouldn't need to use the roads at all...lots of trails to use

No facilities (toilets etc)...but we may be able to offer a comfort break on the outward and return journey eg Goldsmiths / Les Laveurs Car Park
