ENTREPÔT

Throughout history the island of Jersey has always operated as an entrepôt- a trading post between Europe, the United Kingdom and the wider world. Entrepôt explore how, through the prism of colonial and family history. Jersey's original wealth generated by the proceeds from the North Atlantic fisheries and maritime trade in the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries lay the foundation for the island's future prosperity. Combining work from both long-term research and lens-based projects on fish The Seaflower Venture and finance Masterplan it proposes to re-address parts of the legacy upon which Jersey's economic growth and development in the past, present and future has been told. Theoretically, Entrepôt is based around Rosemary E. Ommer's structural economical analysis of the Jersey-Gaspé cod fishery which reveals a functional three-pointed trading system in what she refers to as a 'merchant triangle' with production in Canada, management in Jersey and markets in the West Indies, South America, Mediterranean and the Baltic. The project is centred around cod-merchant Charles Robin who founded the most successful Jersey firm on the Gaspé Peninsula and the extraordinary photographic archive and unpublished biographical narrative of Robin's life based on his own diaries written by Phyllis Gertrude Ross in the 1950s. Using her manuscript of some 275,000 words as a narrative structure, and probing this important history of Jersey's maritime identity through a photographic discourse the project explore the creative potential for image-making between the fictional and non-fictional story about Robin's trading posts in the new British colonies in North America and its merchant networks in the West Indies. South America, Mediterranean and the Baltic.

Since 2017 several trips to colonial outposts in the maritime network has been completed; travelling over 60,000 kms across land, sea and air, researching multiple archives and developing a large repository of new visual and textual material.


Project Outcomes & Delivery

Entrepôt is a collaborative photographic research project between Martin Toft and the Société Jersiaise Photographic Archive in the island of Jersey. A number of desired creative outcomes are planned to be delivered.

- —Publications comprising a set of 7 individual photobooks (Entrepôt), each representing an entrepôt in the transatlantic maritime network, and a stand-alone novel (The Seaflower Venture) of the unpublished biographical narrative of Charles Robin, written by Phyllis Gertrude Ross.
- Audio-visual film with video footage recorded from various ports where Jersey vessels would trade, including St Helier Harbour.
 Narrated with a reading from The Seaflower Venture manuscript and Charles Robin's 18th century diary.
- Major exhibition touring locally and internationally to places that were part of the international merchant network.
- Outdoor semi-permanent installation in St Helier Harbour and Marina.
- Visual material to be deposited in the Contemporary Photography Collection at the Société Jersiaise Photographic Archive for future research and public enjoyment.







It will provide a vital legacy and resource to effectively tell the story about the island's connectivity to the sea for trade, commerce and its economic prosperity past and present.

BIO

Martin Toft is an artist and educator who has exhibited and published widely internationally. He works on commissions and long-term independent and collaborative projects and his practice combines documentary and fine art approach to explore social, anthropological and cultural themes, underpinned by archival research. He has exhibited in places such as the House of Commons, Shakespeare's Globe Theatre (London), Watershed Gallery (Bristol), Museet for Fotokunst (Odense, Denmark), Worker's Museum and Øksnehallen (Copenhagen) and recently invited to show work from Masterplan at CAPITAL, Ballarat International Foto Biennale 2019 (Australia) and TAXED TO THE MAX, Noorderlicht International Photography Festival 2019 in Groningen, The Netherlands. In 2018 he was shortlisted in the Professional Discovery category at Sony World Photography Awards and his portrait 'High Net Worth Individual' was selected as a winner in Portrait of Britain 2018 in association with The British Journal of Photography. Recent publications include, Atlantus (2015) a multifunctional newspaper in collaboration with Gareth Syvret and Kummer & Herrman which has been exhibited widely in the UK, Europe and USA. In 2016 it was nominated for the Prix du Livre Author Book Award at Les Rencontres de la photographie, Arles. His recent book Te Ahi Kã - The Fires of Occupation (2018) was shortlisted for the Kassel Dummy Award 2018 and 2019 Best International Photography Book of the Year PHotoEspaña. It was published under the imprint of Dewi Lewis Publishing and designed by Ania Nałecka-Milach.
